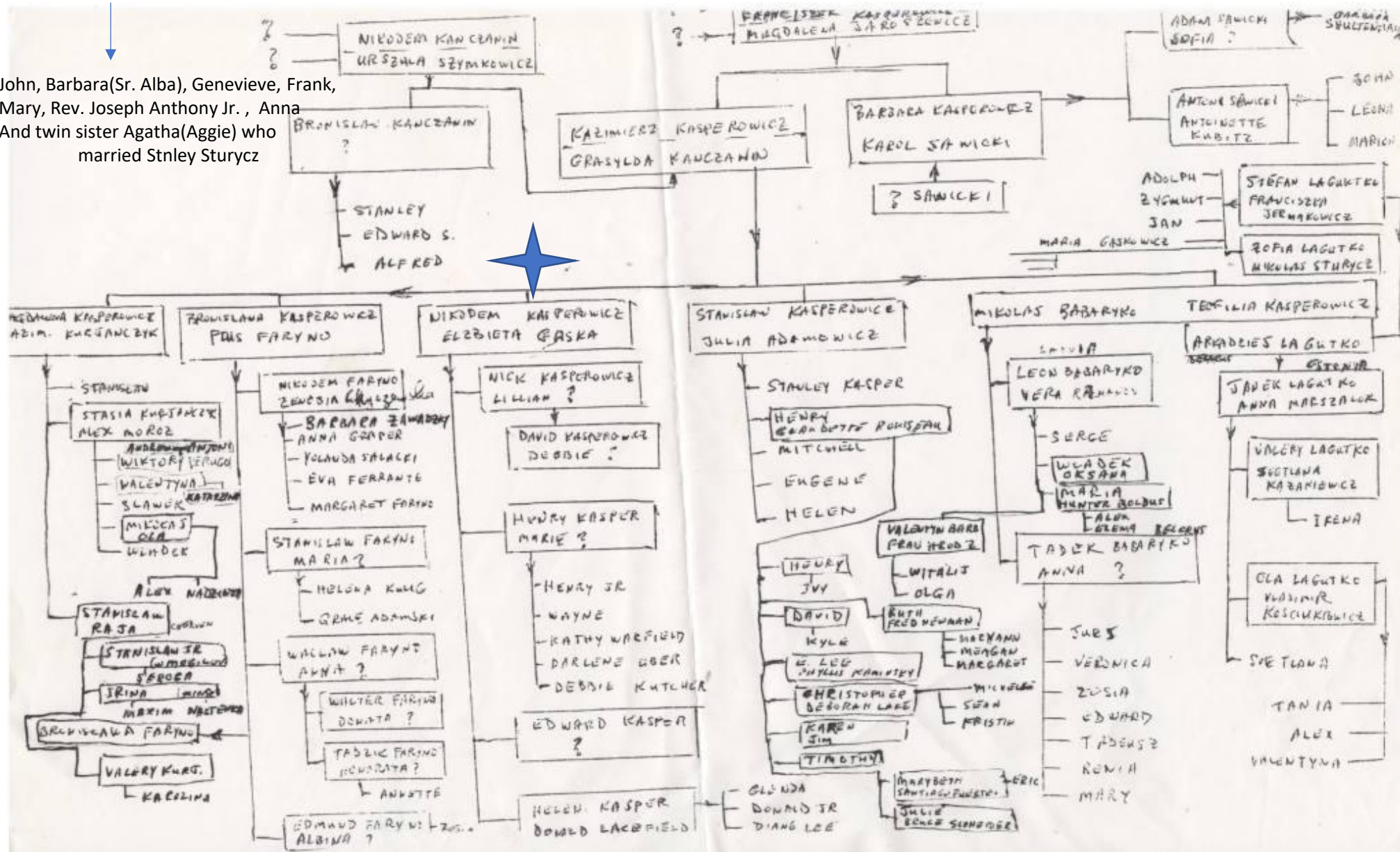

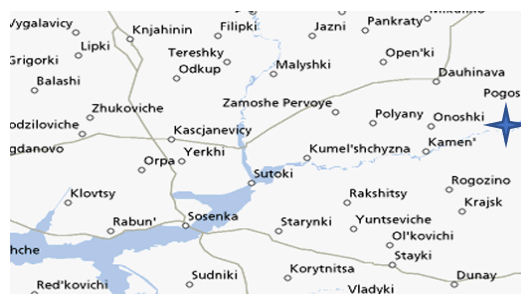
Nikodem's immigration to the United States in the early years of the 20th century.

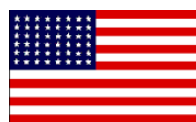

(Historical note: During period of above listed births, Poland did not exist and was partitioned by/into Russia, Germany and the Austria Hungarian Empire. The village of Onoszki was in the Russian partitioned area. In 1918 all the partitioned areas were restored and Poland after 125 years again existed. After the 2nd World War, the western frontier of Poland – our ancestral land – was ceded to the Soviets and is now in Belarus.)

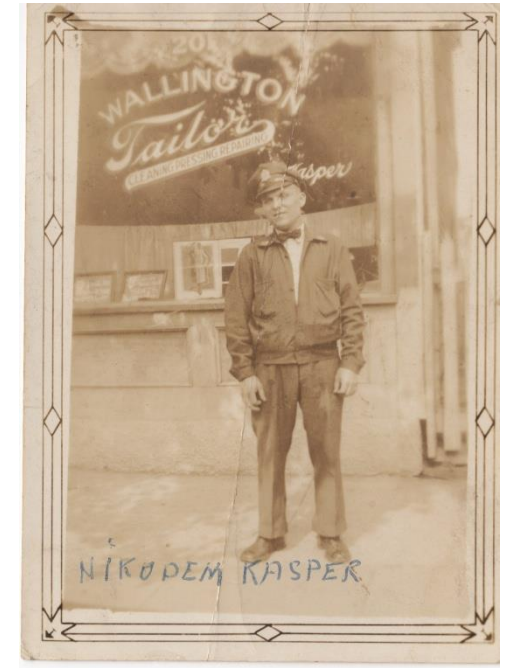

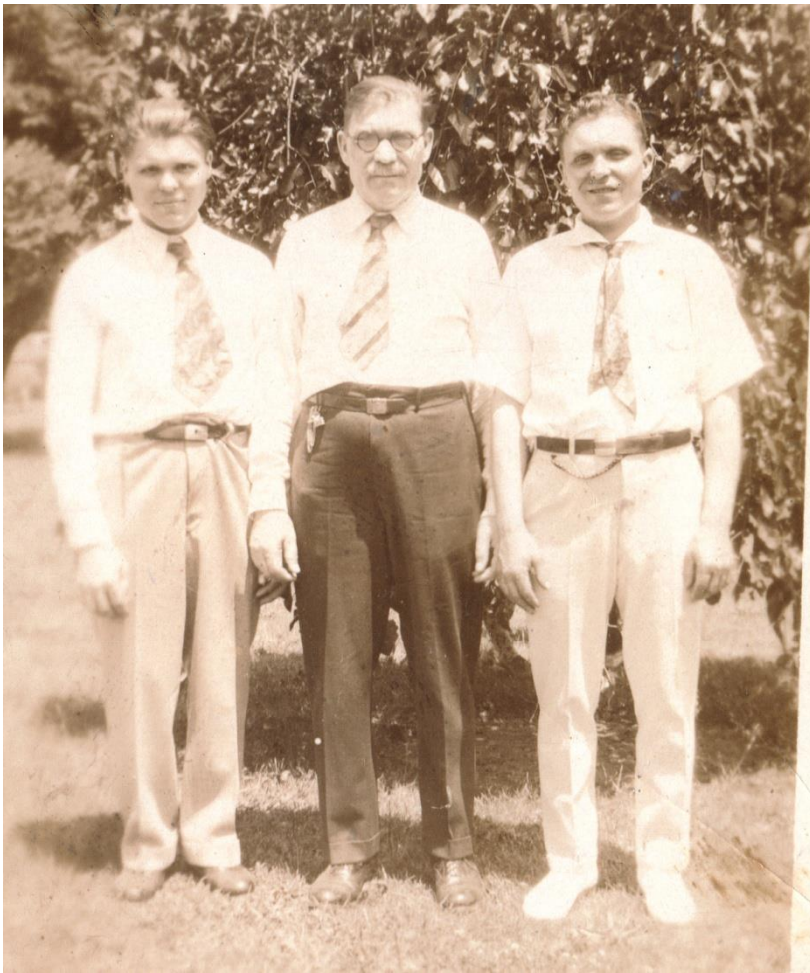

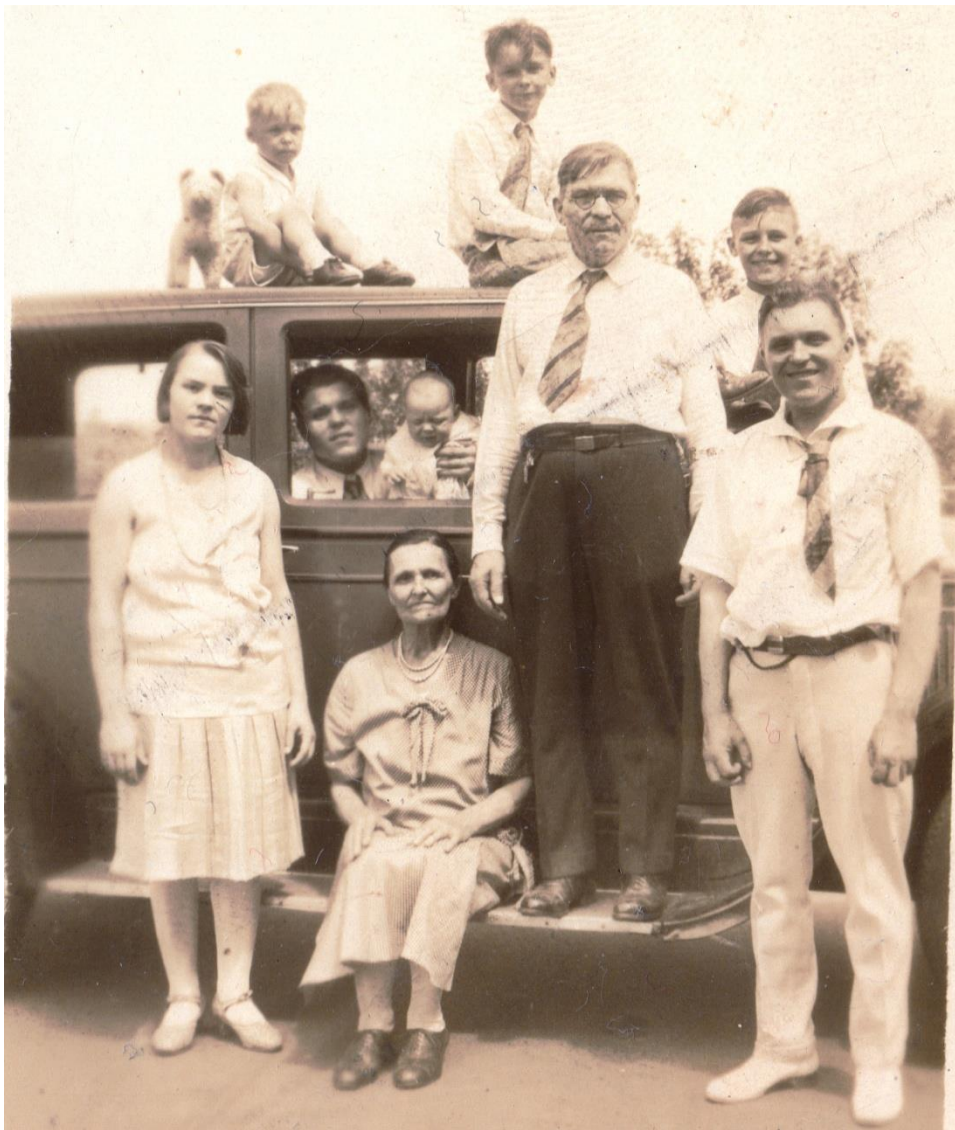

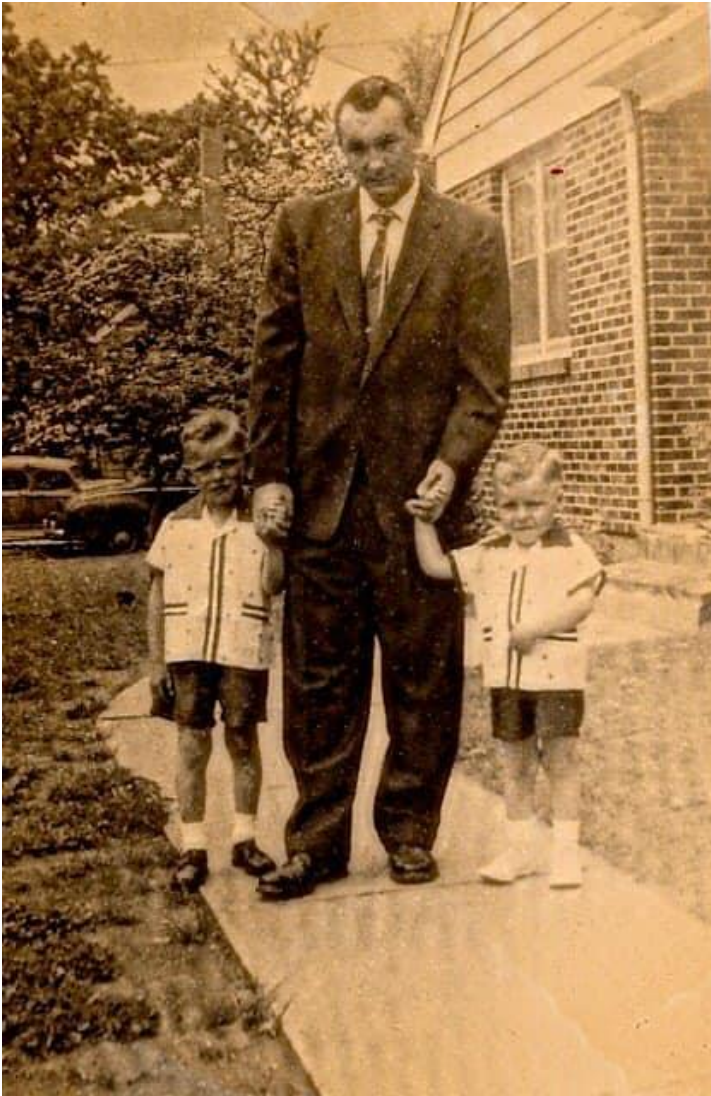
